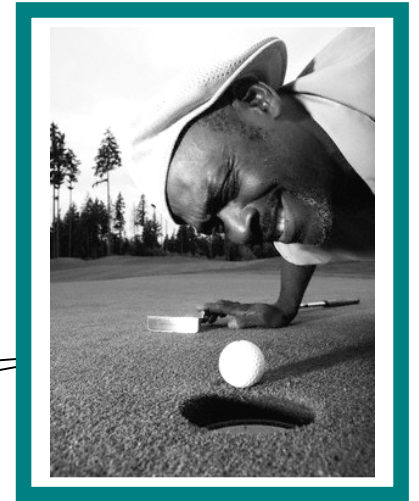


# Feeling like this?
